Our Journey To SUD Treatment Services Integration



Steps To Demonstrating Patient-Directed Care

- ✓ **Train health center staff** on de-stigmatizing language during onboarding and through annual refreshers
- ✓ **Apply de-stigmatizing and plain language** when collaborating with other providers
- ✓ **Get buy-in** from all staff on a patient-directed workflow
- ✓ **Train health center staff** to recognize signs of overdose and act

De-Stigmatizing Language Examples

Instead of...

Use...

Addict

- Person with substance use disorder

Former addict

- Person in recovery or long-term recovery

User

- Patient

Alcoholic

- Person with alcohol use disorder

Habit

- Substance use disorder
- Drug addiction

Relapse

- Resumed use

Abuse

For illicit drugs:

- Use

For prescription medications:

- Misuse
- Used other than prescribed

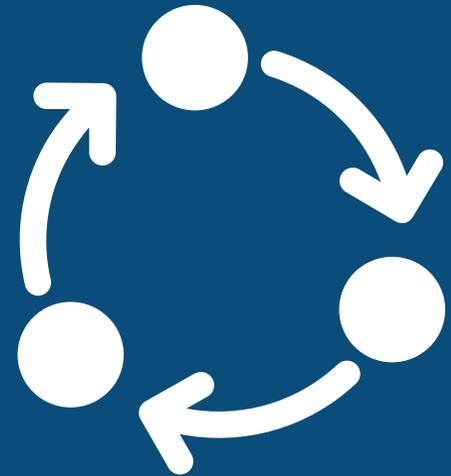

- ✓ **Review** current SUD screening and assessment tools
- ✓ **Assess administration:** who, when, and how
- ✓ **Troubleshoot** barriers—find your champions

Screening to Brief Intervention (S2BI)	Drugs and Alcohol	Adolescents	Self- or clinician-administered
Brief Screener for Alcohol, Tobacco, and other Drugs (BSTAD)	Drugs and Alcohol	Adolescents	Self- or clinician-administered
Alcohol Screening and Brief Intervention for Youth: A Practitioner’s Guide*	Alcohol	Adolescents	Clinician-administered

Alcohol Screening and Brief Intervention for Youth: A Practitioner's Guide*	Alcohol	Adolescents	Clinician-administered
Car, Relax, Alone, Forget, Friends, Trouble (CRAFFT)	Drugs and Alcohol	Adolescents	Self- or clinician-administered
Drug Abuse Screen Test (DAST-10)^	Drugs	Adults	Self- or clinician-administered
Drug Abuse Screen Test (DAST-20: Adolescent version)^	Drugs and Alcohol	Adolescents	Self- or clinician-administered

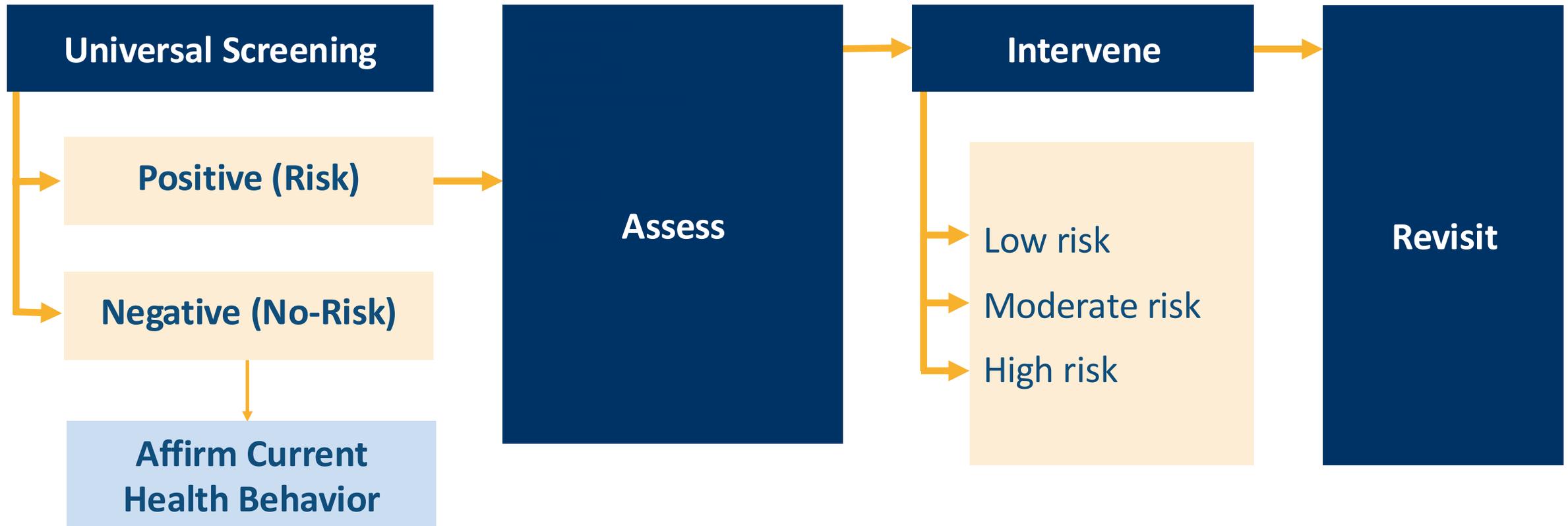

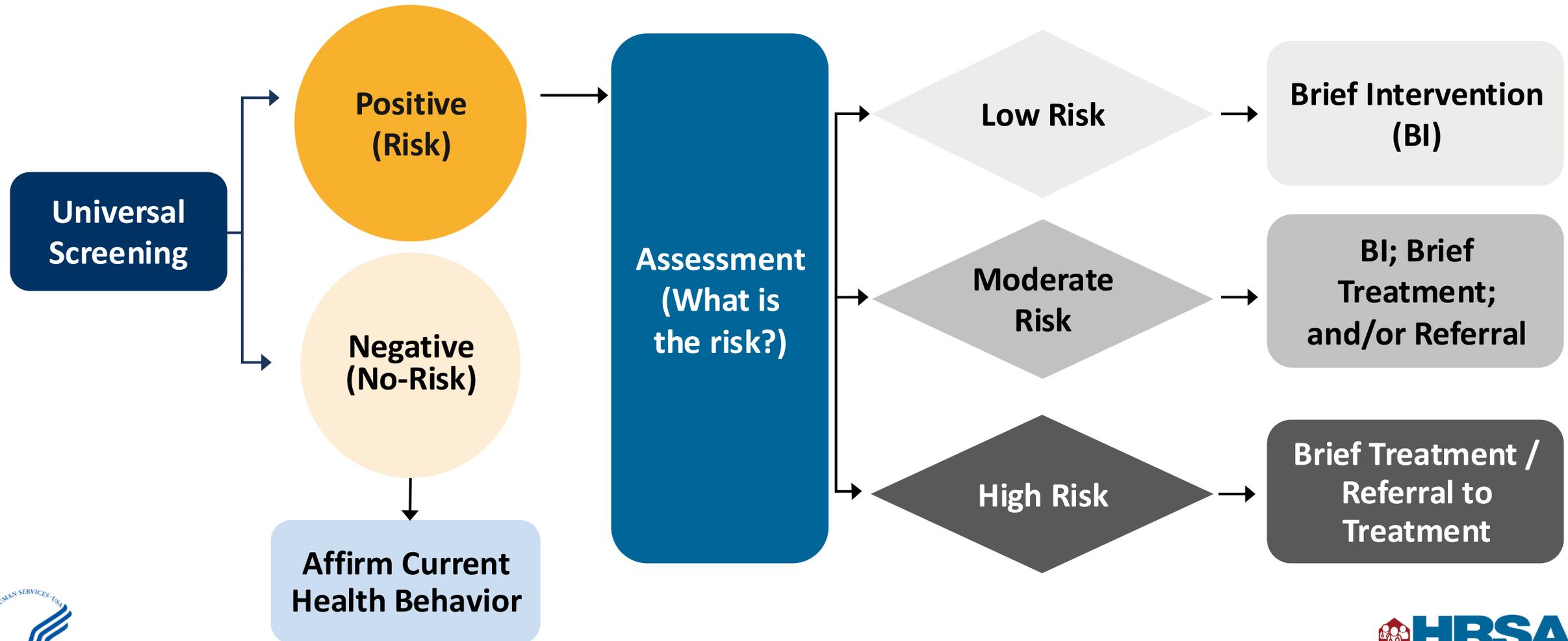

Response to Screening for Substance Use



Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) Workflow



Interventions to Support Behavior Change

- Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT)
- Motivational Interviewing (MI)
- Cognitive-Behavioral Therapy
- Mindfulness-based
- Contingency Management
- 12-Step Program/Rationale Recovery
- Couples or family therapy

Key Components of a Referral Network

Learning SUD treatment resources in your community

- Behavioral health providers, SUD treatment, criminal justice, social support, community groups, etc.

Developing formal agreements

- Define communication expectations (data privacy and 42 CFR Part 2)
- Standardize referral forms/templates

Incorporating referrals into the workflow

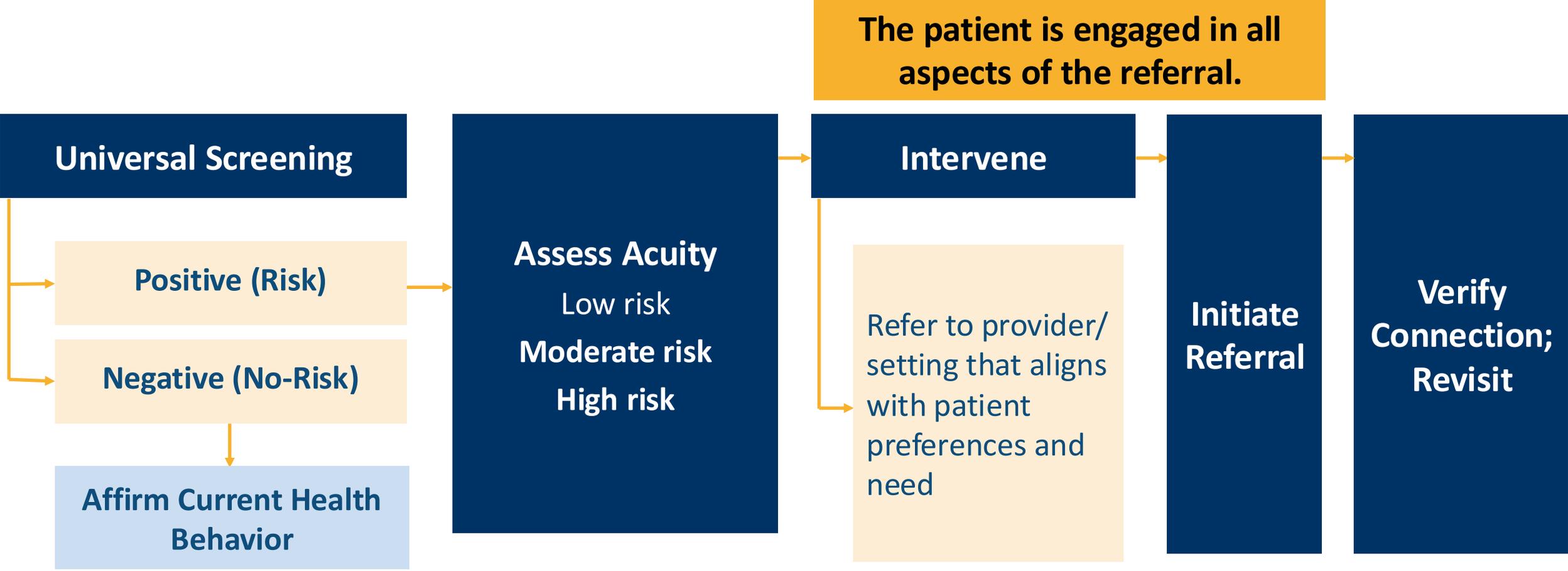
- Who initiates? Who tracks? How does hand-off happen? What feedback is shared?
- Use an electronic health record or other tool?

Assigning quality metrics

- Examples may include number of referrals made, number of referrals accepted, no-shows, time-to-appointment, patient satisfaction, health outcomes

Sustainability Challenges in Integrated SUD Care

- **Workforce capacity and resilience**
 - Workforce instability may be a risk to long-term integration
- **Finance and reimbursement**
 - One-time grant funding
 - Misalignment between clinical workflows and billing
- **Workflow and clinical integration**
 - Inconsistent screening implementation
 - Unclear staff roles
- **Data privacy**
 - Over-application of 42 CFR Part 2 can unintentionally silo SUD care
- **Leadership, organizational environment, and stigma**
 - Maintaining alignment as priorities shift

SUD Integration Monitoring and Reporting

Accountability to Funders



Continuous Quality Improvement

- **Quantitative data** (e.g., number of screenings, days to care following positive screenings)
- **Qualitative data** (e.g., staff's level of comfort with SUD conversations)

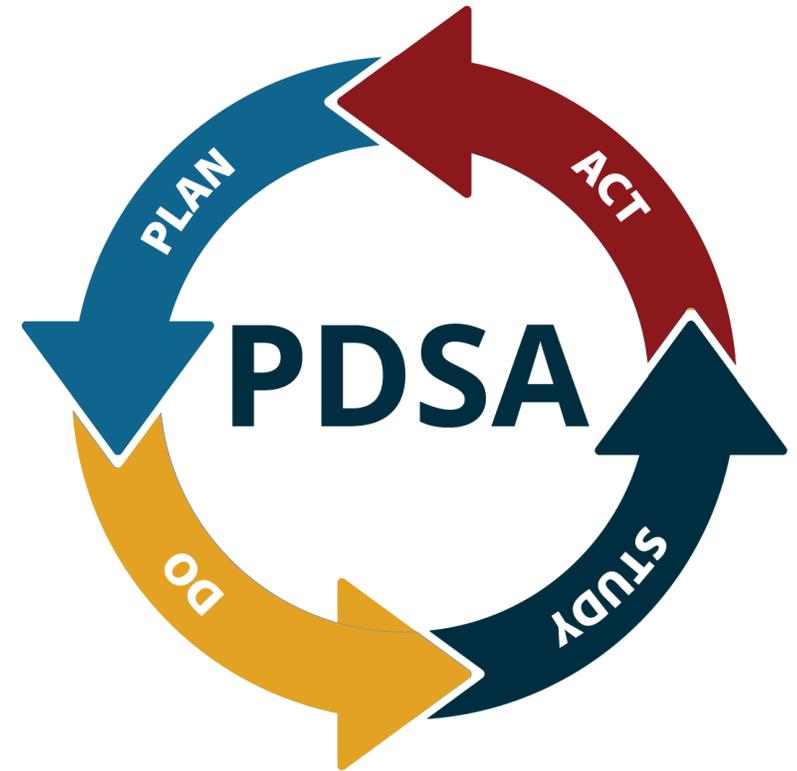

- What metrics would your health center monitor?

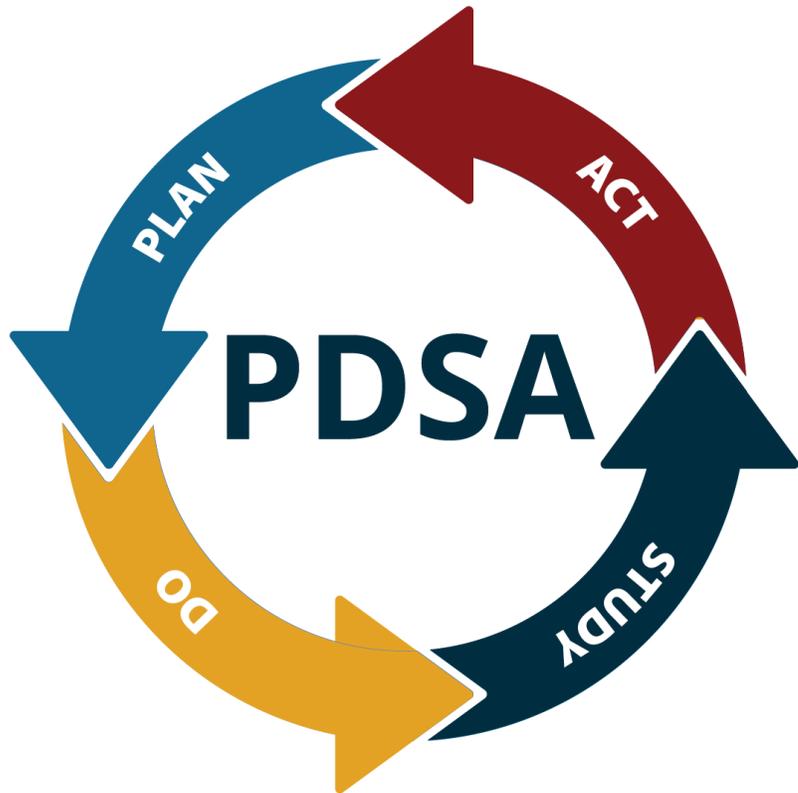
