

# Creating a Safe, Supportive School Environment

Addressing behavioral health in a school-based setting requires buy-in and engagement from the following groups to **build trust**.

- Administration
- Clinical staff
- School nurses and guidance counselors
- Teachers
- Parents
- Students





# Strategies Supporting Education and Medical Team Collaboration

### A SBHC may work with the school to:

- 1. Support the health care needs of chronically absent students.
- 2. Provide care to students with an asthma management plan.
- 3. Support students with Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) and 504 plans and be present at meetings with school administration when these students' cases are discussed.
- 4. Be present at meetings with school administration and school-sponsored social workers and nurses when issues of behavioral health and substance use are discussed.
- 5. Be part of the solution at the school, grade, and individual level for problems concerning behavioral health and substance use.

# **Honoring Confidentiality**

- Everyone needs to understand the confidentiality laws that apply to health information.
  - Different staff may be subject to different confidentiality and disclosure processes
- Federal and state laws vary. School districts may also have policies.
- Knowing what rules apply to whom helps promote trust, safety, and transparency.



# Confidentiality – Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA)

#### **HIPAA** and minors:


 Generally, HIPAA considers a minor's parent or guardian as their "personal representative" with the right to access their medical information.

### **State laws and exceptions:**

 Integral to understand your particular state laws on confidentially.

# **Staffing Considerations**



### Tailor behavioral health integration to school needs.

- What does your organization want to accomplish?
- What services do you want to offer?
  - 1:1 counseling? Group counseling?
  - Crisis intervention (acute care)?
- What resources are available in your school / community?



### School/student needs drive staffing recruitment and billing strategies.

- Who can bill for the services you want to offer?
- What expertise is needed? What training is needed?



# Staffing for Behavioral Health: Screening

- ✓ What screening tool(s) will you use?
- ✓ When will the screening occur?
- ✓ Who will administer the screening?
- ✓ What is done with the screening result?
- ✓ What is the pathway for referral or treatment?



About 1 in 5 adolescents have a current, diagnosed mental or behavioral health condition.

# **Staffing Categories**



Residents, students, interns. Collaborate with community health providers and universities.



Non-behavioral health-licensed professionals. Medical Assistants (MAs), administrative staff, nurses, community health workers, and other paraprofessionals can assist the BH provider by performing outreach, screening, and referrals.



<u>Medical provider.</u> Consider a medical provider (MP) on staff such as an advanced registered nurse practitioner or primary care physician.



<u>Behavioral health provider.</u> Collaborate with MP, residents, students, interns and/or others to deliver prevention and intervention services at the top of their licensure.



# Staffing – Practical Tips

### Ratio of 1 behavioral health provider per every 500 students.

Assume roughly 10% will need BH services.

### Consider a mix of staff to support screening and treatment.

- Rely on nurses, case managers, and other health-licensed professionals for screenings and referrals.
- Licensed Clinical Social Workers (LCSW), Licensed Mental Health Counselors (LMHC), Behavioral Health Clinicians (BHC), or Licensed Professional Counselors (LPC) may conduct the behavioral intervention.

### Develop relationships with local qualified behavioral health partners.

### Recruit from the community being served.

 Understands and relates to your population's needs; may be more committed to role/community. Residents, students, and interns are other options.
